Board Meeting Report

The following motions were approved by the board at the October 17th meeting:

- A wish list item was approved for \$4,500 for the childrens' playground
- The Endowment Fund Committee has relinquished taking care of the McNee Fund and the board accepted responsibility to oversee it.

The board expressed its gratitude to:

- Karen Walls for her design and work on the UUCLR website
- Bruce Hill and Jade Elledge for serving as two of the first officers of the Arkansas UU Justice Ministry Team
- Warigia Bowman's children, Mariamu Ngaruiya, Ali Ngaruiya, David Ngaruiya, for helping clean up after coffee hour on Sunday, October 16.
- Facilities Team for diligently taking care of the building, grounds, and designing the playground.

Other Items of Interest

- November 6 a study lead by Clinton School students will be held at the church. This study is looking at the relationship between religious engagement and political efficacy. Sixteen churches have committed and UUCLR will invite members to participate. Members are free to engage with the students if they so choose. A table will be set up for surveys and possibly a focus group will be formed by the students.
- Tim Carlock and Bill Kimpel are on a task force on building security. Tim presented a draft printed Policy Manual plan to the Board. We need a Fire Marshall policy and the task force will add three more members to assist and will flesh out the details. Fire station #9 is our closest station and Tim will coordinate with them to review the current plan. A fire drill will need to be performed on a Sunday morning during service and that will be scheduled and follow-up arranged. Swat teams may be available for training.
- Cluster Report – Faith in Action is going to center its work on Black Lives Matter and Transgender Equality. More postings will show up on our Facebook page.
- Childcare is needed for more meetings and this will be studied; the Board supports childcare for team and committee meetings.

Thank you to all who participated in the recent Carnival of Opportunities. The Carnival was great; plus, the Facilities' Table provided donut holes and chocolate chip cookies, thanks to Karen Walls.! We had three new folks sign up to help keep our building and grounds beautiful.

Our building and grounds are maintained by four primary volunteers plus additional support, when requested, from others. We do have an HVAC provider for our Heating and Air Conditioning systems and a service provider for interior cleaning. My point is that our volunteers keep your facility going and we always can use additional support.

Here is the PEP TALK...

During the fall season especially, when our beautiful trees lose their leaves, extra help can keep the grounds clear of the excess leaves, branches, etc., that can and do accumulate. We need folks to check their calendars and commit/set-aside time on a Thursday (if able) or Saturday morning and join us for a couple of hours! From 9:00 to 10:30. That's all it takes when two or more are sharing the load. We have the equipment and supplies; all you need to do is find that time you can share for your church and then commit to join us for these Leaf Fests!

Building Information Update

The Board of Directors is still in the information gathering stage. The Executive Committee met with architects from three firms. Currently, we are waiting for a proposal from one of the architects for the feasibility of enlarging our previous sanctuary and how many more seats we will gain. They are looking at embracing and extending our same design and turning the direction of the sanctuary so that we will be facing the woods. An appraisal of the value of the church was made by Ferstl Valuation Services. From the appraisal we learned that our neighborhood is safer than many in Little Rock and is stable. No decisions have been made, but information about all options is being gathered. One of the facts that we learned is that if we choose to sell the church, it most likely will take at least a year to sell. We also realize without a super large mega donation of over \$6 million, we can rule out the possibility of building a new church. Just remodeling will require significant contributions and how large of a renovation will depend on how generous our donations are. Our "wish list" to properly prepare for our future with enlarged RE, office space, and sanctuary can require almost as much as building from the ground up.

Now the question we will need to answer is, can we afford to do some serious remodeling, or is there another place that will meet our needs and cost us less than remodeling? I understand that everyone wants the answer now, but we are on "church time" and although the answers are coming slowly, we hope they will be solid. Please rest assured, no big decisions will be made without all of us making it together when we have the facts.

Meanwhile, we are discovering our needs as we grow, so we are working on Fire and Safety plans, a new policy for how we use communication lines, information packets for new leaders, and a playground for young children in front of Thomson Hall. The wish list for the electronic door hardware has been fulfilled and a new wish list for the children's playground of \$4,500 has been created. If someone wants to donate to fund this project in memory or celebration of a loved one, recognition will be given through a brass commemorative plaque on the wall and by other means to be discussed. A gift to our children is a gift to our future. Please speak with Bill Goolsby, chair of the Finance and Stewardship Committee, if you would like to donate to the playground fund.

Thank you for your patience as we diligently work together to make decisions about our future.

Walk for Community

UUCLR has supported Just Communities of Arkansas for at least 15 years by participating in this walk, which will be held this year on **November 6**. We meet at the River Market Pavilion at 3:00pm. At about 4:00, we walk across the Clinton Bridge to North Little Rock. Adults, people in wheelchairs, families with kids, people with leashed dogs and/or pushing strollers all walk for about 30-45 minutes. We then return to the Pavilion to eat pizza and ice cream. The typical amount raised by UUCLR is about \$200, although in the past, we had as many as 20 walkers, enough to carry the UUCLR banner.

Just Communities of Arkansas has worked to improve communications among disparate community groups including police, citizens, races, ethnicities, and governing bodies. They hold training sessions in conflict resolution, among other efforts. They work with teens through Our Town for Teens, the summer program that Theo Segura spoke so eloquently about as a positive influence for him in a time of emotional turmoil.
