REFLECTIONS: How I Spent the Martin Luther King Holiday REV. PAUL BEEDLE



On the Saturday before the holiday, about a dozen UUCLR members took part in the Day of Service event at McDermott Elementary School, now one of Little Rock's designated Community Schools. On the actual holiday, I attended City Year of Little Rock's Equity Summit at Henderson Middle School. Our friend Jennifer Cobb, City Year of Little Rock's Executive Director, met me at the door and expressed her thanks that so many of us came to help.

City Year is a program born in Boston in 1988. When President Clinton created AmeriCorps in 1993, among those he enlisted to help were City Year's founders, Michael Brown and Alan Khazei. City Year became a member organization of AmeriCorps, and President Clinton asked Stephanie Streett (now Executive Director of the Clinton Foundation) to bring City Year to Little Rock. City Year's mission is to support students and schools, develop civic leaders, and to share promising practices discovered in its local partnerships.

Young adult AmeriCorps members serve in schools all day, every day, preparing students with academic, workforce and interpersonal skills they need to succeed in school and in life. Through this work, they acquire valuable skills that help them and prepare

them to be leaders in their communities and their careers. And they earn a stipend.

Most in the room that afternoon were bright young African Americans, many of whom attended a school with City Year programs. There were also a handful of community members like me, there to learn about equity in education. The four-hour summit included interactive presentations on four topics:

- "Breaking Language Barriers: Supporting English Language Learners for Inclusive and Equitable Education";
- "Healthy Minds, Healthy Futures: Advancing • Health and Dental Equity form student Success";
- "Safe Spaces, Strong Futures: Promoting Equity for LGBTQIA+ Students in Education"; and
- "Emerging Practices," which included presentations about Community Schools (by the city of Little Rock's Chief Education Officer, Jennifer Glasgow) and creating pathways for Black men to enter and thrive as professional teachers (by Little Rock school District teacher Deandre Smith).

Much in these presentations served as continuing education for these young adult AmeriCorps members to equip them to serve the students they tutor and support more effectively.

Community Schools like McDermott seek to address inequities in education and foster stronger connections between schools, families, and communities. Besides McDermott, there are five other elementary schools (Stephens, Chicot, Washington, Watson, and Mabelville) and two middle schools (Dunbar and Mabelville) designated Community Schools. Programs developed in Community Schools vary from school to school according to community needs and available partnerships, and may include services to address food insecurity, hygiene, clothing, transportation needs, and mental health support.

I came away inspired and with a renewed feeling of hope for the future. These young adults are clearly motivated and committed to helping their students and the community. I can't think of a better way I could have spent the holiday.


